



Forsyth County Schools Forensic Science Syllabus 2023/2024

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Course Description (GaDOE): In this course students will learn the scientific protocols for analyzing a crime scene, how to use chemical and physical separation methods to isolate and identify materials, how to analyze biological evidence and the criminal use of tools, including impressions from firearms, tool marks, arson, and explosive evidence.

Required Assignments: There will be approximately 10 units of study, each accompanied by 1-2 summative assessments, primarily consisting of various performance-based assessments that require writing, research, and well-executed lab protocol. The number of formative assignments such as quizzes, assignments, learning labs, etc. will be determined along the course of the school year. Students should expect new material each day and assignments that are either content building or content practice in preparation for assessments.
