

Medallions



To earn a medallion, students must be a member of a specific honor society and have completed at least 3 courses within their area of completion, as well as additional requirements.

Medallions can be earned in the following areas: advanced academic, fine arts, foreign language, and career tech.

Students must complete a virtual "Pathway Verification Form" and turn it in by March 1st.

If a student qualifies for a medallion in multiple areas, they will receive a "pin" for each additional pathway. Students will only receive 1 medallion.







College Application Process

- 1. Determine what college(s) to apply to
- 2. Review deadlines & determine when you will apply (early, regular, rolling admissions)
- 3. Determine what application format you will use.
 - a. Common App, Coalition, gaFutures, or other
- 4. Submit application & application fees (usually range from \$50-\$90 per institution)
- 5. Submit supporting documentation.
 - a. Transcript
 - b. Test Scores
 - c. Letters of Recommendation (if required)
 - d. Essay (if required)
- 6. Follow up with admissions frequently.
 - a. Check portal
 - b. Rolling admissions
 - c. Scholarships/Housing information







What is a school report?



A school report contains:


- GPA
- Class Rank
- Transcript
- Brief likert scale academic and extracurricular assessment

A school report CANNOT be submitted until a Common App transcript is requested from Parchment.

A counselor recommendation will only be completed if it is required by the college.

Transcript Request/Self Reporting









- No nicknames
- Accurate year of graduation (2024)
- If parents are completing for students, please use student's DOB and graduation year

Letters of Recommendation

- 1. Check to see if this is a necessary part of your college application. We will not write letters if they will not be read.
- Provide your counselor or teacher with your resume and Letter of Recommendation Info Sheet.
- Provide recommender with application due date, making sure to give them at least 7-10 business days to complete your request.
- 4. Remember, we do not work during school breaks.

**Guidelines- Ask a teacher that knows you very well to write you a letter. This could be a club sponsor or a teacher that you have had that can speak to your struggle or investment in a course. Teachers reserve the right to decline your request for a letter of recommendation.

What are the 2023-24 Common App essay prompts?

Below is the full set of Common App essay prompts for 2023-24.

- Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they
 believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please
 share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Reflect on something that someone has done for you that has made you happy or thankful in a surprising way. How has this gratitude affected or motivated you?
- Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging that it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

We will also retain the optional COVID-19 question within the Additional Information section.

Test scores must be submitted directly from the testing agency.

SAT- 4 free score reports each time you take the test (up to 9 days past the exam); \$14 each

ACT- 4 free score reports each time you take the test; \$18 each after

Accuplacer- Take at technical college

ASVAB- Take with a military recruiter, or at DHS. Check with Mr. Brooks about test dates.

*Please note that some colleges will allow for super scoring and others will only accept a single test score

10 College Application Mistakes to Avoid

- 1. Failing to read directions
- 2. Not taking ownership of applications
- 3. Submitting a lengthy resume
- 4. Not proofreading applications
- 5. Waiting until the last minute
- 6. Repeating yourself
- 7. Asking the obvious questions
- 8. Writing a generic essay
- 9. Overemphasizing extracurriculars
- 10. Not checking class requirements



Financial Aid- HOPE/Zell Miller

- Access your HOPE GPA at any time on the gaFutures website.
- **HOPE Scholarship**: Minimum 3.0 HOPE GPA & 4 rigor requirements
 - Typically covers 75-85% of tuition costs (based on lottery funding)
- **Zell Miller Scholarship**: Minimum 3.7 Zell Miller GPA; Minimum combined score of 1200 on the math and reading portions of the SAT or a minimum composite score of 26 on the ACT (single national administration of either test) and meet 4 rigor requirements
 - Covers 100% of tuition at public institutions in GA
 - Lowers to 3.3 GPA requirement in college
- **How is it computed?** Core classes only including foreign language, .5 quality point for AP/DE courses, never goes above a 4.0
- How do I apply? https://fafsa.ed.gov/
- Students are re-evaluated every 30 credit hours to earn or lose HOPE/Zell Miller in college.

Financial Aid- HOPE/Zell Miller



If you do not have a social security card on file with the school, you are not eligible for HOPE/Zell Miller.

The easiest way to check is to see if you are eligible is to access "YOUR HOPE GPA" on gaFutures.





