- ✓3 Social Studies
- ✓3 Career/Fine Arts/Modern Lang.\*
- ✓ Health/Personal Fitness
- √ 4 additional electives
- ✓ 23 Total Units

Special Note: If you are planning on attending a 4-year university you must take a minimum of 2 credits in the same modern language.



### Understanding your GPA

Your **GPA** is the average of your quality points. It is the way that colleges interpret your academic success.

Percentage Grade	Letter Grade	Quality Points
90-100	Α	4.0

#### Dual Enrollment

 Dual Enrollment – Opportunity for GA high school students to take courses from a state public or private postsecondary institution while still enrolled as a high school student and receive credit BOTH at the high school and at the postsecondary institution.

#### • A common example:

A student can take ENG 1101 at UNG. This course would count as their first semester college course **and** count as their High School Senior Lit course at WFHS.

### Internship Forsyth (Work-Based Learning)

• Internship Forsyth is a structured experience which connects classroom learning to an engaging job opportunity. Internships can be paid or unpaid. Students are allowed to leave the school campus to intern with local businesses, earning course credit for the experience.

A common example:

A student can work 10 hours a week at Chick-fil-A. This would count as two elective courses meaning they would leave after 5<sup>th</sup> period each day.

### What is a Technical School?

- Technical schools are also known as technical colleges or institutes and offer an education that prepares students for a specific trade or career. They typically offer 2-year programs. Following the completion of the course, graduates are awarded a degree, certificate, or diploma.
- Technical colleges tend to offer more hands-on learning and require fewer unnecessary classes than four-year colleges.
- Typical areas of study include business administration, culinary arts, engineering, automotive technology, computer technology, medical technology, and cosmetology.
- Two Technical Schools near us are Lanier Technical College and Gwinnett Technical College, but there are many across the state.
