About Lambert High School

Longhorn pride is felt as soon as you walk into the doors of Lambert High School. From the spirit wear that students proudly sport to the walls covered with the logo, Lambert High School is a very recognizable brand in the area and rest of the state. The community is joining in the pride of being a Longhorn as the “Horns” are on cars, worn on shirts, current and future Longhorn parents are present at sporting and fine arts activities. Often, we are regaled with stories of Lambert High School Alumni who are making waves and changing the world. Lambert currently has students present at each of the military academies, most of the Ivy League schools, and nearly any university you can mention. Our school is composed of grades 9 through 12, and that equals approximately 3000 students. LHS offers the typical high school experience with numerous academic courses (including AP), clubs, activities, and sports. The Longhorns compete in the 5AAAAAAA region for sports.

Graduation Requirements

High school students are evaluated using a report card with numeric averages from 0 - 100. Students must meet diploma requirements in three areas:

- 1. Assessments: All students take the Georgia Milestones End of Course (EOC) assessments in 9th grade Language Arts, American Literature, Algebra, Geometry, United States History, Economics, Physical Science, and Biology. These students must pass the course to meet graduation requirements.*
- 2. Courses: Students must complete and pass specific EOC course requirements as outlined by the graduation rule.*
- 3. Credits: Students must earn 23 units as a minimum state requirement for graduation.*

COVID-19 Impact

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, all Forsyth County Schools transitioned to online learning on March 13, 2020 and continued through the end of the 2019-20 school year. Forsyth County Schools' students remained enrolled in all of their previously scheduled courses and were awarded numeric grades at the end of the term for all courses. Forsyth County Schools instituted a "Hold Harmless" provision for the last 9 weeks of the 2019-20 school year, which meant that for all grade levels, the totality of student work assigned and submitted during online learning, March 16-May 22, 2020, only had a positive impact on the overall semester average.

To begin the 2020-2021 school year, students were given the option of returning to face-to-face learning, participating in full-time virtual courses through Forsyth Virtual Academy, or a hybrid version of both options. All middle and high schools are on a block schedule for the fall 2020 semester. Students are able to take a maximum of 7 courses and a minimum of 6, with seniors minimum being 4 courses.
