About Forsyth County Schools

FCS serves over 53,500 students. FCS is the 5th largest out of 180 school districts in Georgia. For 2023-2024, we are home to 42 schools – 23 elementary, 11 middle, 7 high, and 1 college and career high school. As one of the nation's top 10 fastest growing communities, Forsyth County's growth and increasing diversity have had a positive impact on our schools. Highly motivated students come to our classrooms locally and from all over the world, representing 129 countries and 69 languages. The fastest-growing population is Asian students at 27%; the student population is also comprised of White 49%, Hispanic 15%, Black or African American 5%, Two or more races 4%, American Indian or Alaska Native and Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander, which are both under 1%.

Graduation Requirements

High school students are evaluated using a report card with numeric averages from 0 - 100. Students must meet diploma requirements in three areas:

1. **Assessments:** All students take the Georgia Milestones End of Course (EOC) assessments in American Literature, Algebra I, United States History, and Biology. These students must pass the course to meet graduation requirements.
2. **Courses:** Students must complete and pass specific EOC course requirements as outlined by the graduation rule.
3. **Credits:** Students must earn 23 units as a minimum state requirement for graduation.

From the spirit wear that students proudly sport to the walls covered with the logo, Lambert High School is a very recognizable brand in the area and rest of the state. The community is joining in the pride of being a Longhorn as the “Horns” are on cars, worn on shirts, current and future Longhorn parents are present at sporting and fine arts activities. Often, we are regaled with stories of Lambert High School Alumni who are making waves and changing the world. Lambert often has students present at each of the military academies, most of the Ivy League schools, and nearly any university you can mention. Our school is composed of grades 9 through 12, and that equals approximately 3200 students. LHS offers the typical high school experience with numerous academic courses (including AP), clubs, activities, and sports. The Longhorns compete in the 5AAAAAAA region for sports.

Course Credit and Scheduling Considerations

Students may fill up to 7 periods a year with courses taken at Lambert High School, through online partner schools and programs such as Forsyth Virtual and Georgia Virtual School, and through dual enrollment. Some students earn more than 7 credits a year by participating in the dual enrollment program. Forsyth County School District also allows students to add online, self-pay courses to their transcript that have been taken outside of the school day. We ask that no student be penalized for taking only the maximum 7 periods maximum allotted in their Lambert schedule.
