- 1) To provide positive male role models for the students, demonstrating by their presence that education is important.
- 2) To provide extra sets of eyes and ears to enhance school security and reduce bullying.

Who are WATCH D.O.G.S.?

WatchDOGS are fathers, grandfathers, uncles, and other father-figures who volunteer for just **one** day each year at an official WATCH D.O.G.S. ® school, like Brandywine Elementary.

What do WATCH D.O.G.S. Do?

We offer two opportunities to volunteer. On Wednesday mornings dads can come help with the carpool line from 7:00 until 7:40 when the tardy bell rings. On Fridays, dads will volunteer for a half day. You arrive at 7:00 for morning carpool, you are introduced on the morning news, you help teachers in the classroom (including your student's class) by playing games or reading, etc., you get to have lunch, and if the timing works, you can even go to recess! Your day is done at around 12:00.
