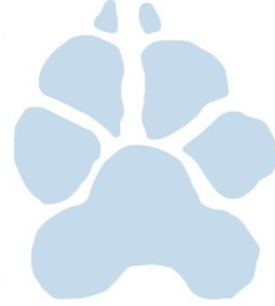

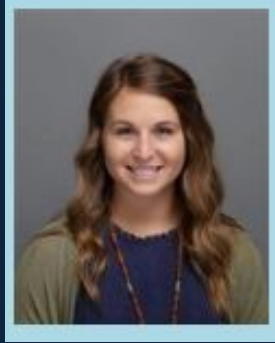

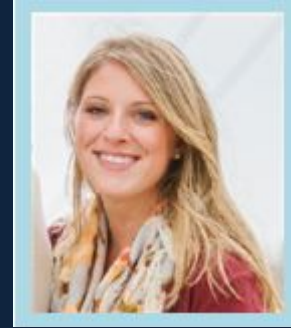

What is dual enrollment?

- Georgia's Dual Enrollment program allows 11th and 12th grade high school students to earn college credit while working on their high school diploma. The Dual Enrollment program covers tuition, mandatory fees and required textbooks.
- Students enrolled in Dual Enrollment may complete up to 30 semester/45 quarter credit hours at a Georgia post secondary institution.
- You may choose to have a full time schedule of Dual Enrollment courses, or you may choose to have a combination of high school and DE courses.

Benefits

- Introduces students to college-level coursework.
- Earning college credits while still in high school may enable students to graduate early.
- Helps students adjust to certain aspects of the college experience (e.g., classes, coursework, and instruction, being on a college campus) so the transition from high school to college may be easier.
- Students who participate in a dual enrollment program are more likely to go to college and get a college degree.

Benefits Continued...

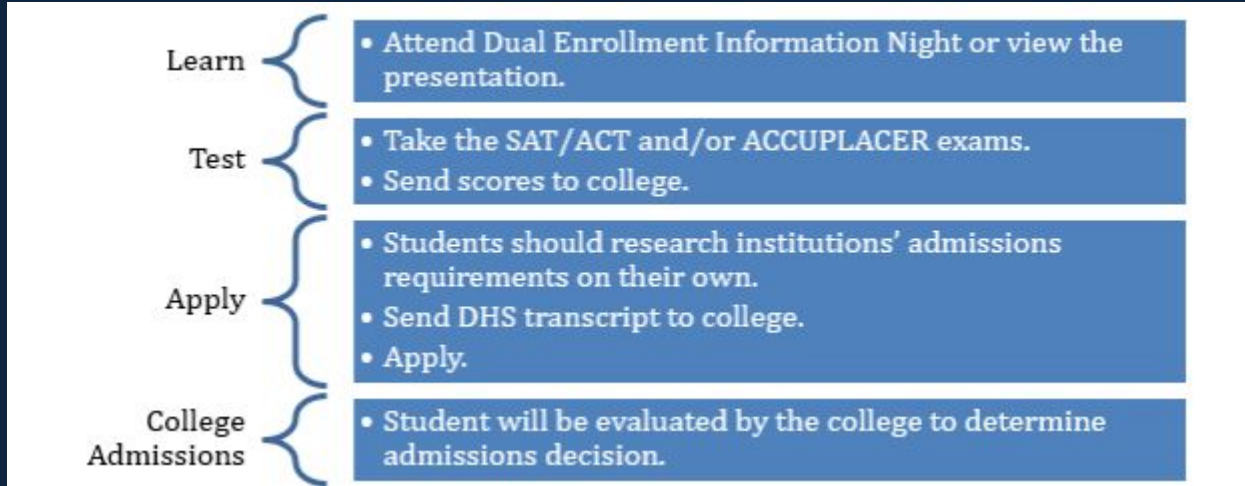
- Students may be able to take classes that are not offered at their high school, especially in subject areas they are interested in for a potential career.
- Participating in a dual enrollment program demonstrates a student's ability to handle more difficult coursework which is something college admissions officers may look upon favorably during admissions and recruiting.
- Taking college-level classes while still in high school may build confidence and encourage those students who may not be thinking about college to reconsider.
- Save Money, Save Time

Successful Dual Enrollment students are...

- Students who are self-motivated, highly organized, and are excellent self advocates.
- Students who are comfortable being in classes with college age students.
- Students who have a specific interest they are pursuing with their DE courses OR have a specific goal in mind.

How it works...

Part 2 (Parent-Student-Counselor)

HS Counselor Parent/Guardian and Student Meeting	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Email your counselor to set up a meeting time to discuss the program and course selection.• Fill out pre-meeting survey prior to meeting.• Counselor will assist with filling out Student Participation Agreement.
Funding	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Student must log on to www.gafutures.org and complete the online Dual Enrollment Funding Application. Students are required to complete the online Dual Enrollment Funding Application each semester they participate.
College Course Registration	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Student must set up a meeting with an advisor at the college to register for classes. The college advisor will be your point of contact at the college level.
Schedule	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Each semester, students must submit the most up-to-date copy of their college schedule to their counselor. Student's high school schedule cannot be altered and funding cannot be approved without the college schedule.

Things to consider before applying...

- Do you plan to participate your Junior or Senior year?
 - Think about transportation and class times, maturity
- Do you plan to participate full-time or part-time?
 - You can still play sports if you are full-time
- What type of classes do you want to take?
- Are you comfortable advocating for yourself and asking questions of your teachers on a regular basis? Are you passing your high school courses? Are you comfortable researching and applying college on your own?

Two Schedules

- College Schedule (MWF, TH, Online)
- High School Schedule
- Implications: Fall Break, Spring Break, Midterms/Finals

Things school counselors cannot manage...

- Class times at the college
- Grading systems at the college
- Professor/student issues
- Attendance at the college
- Add/Drop/Withdraw Period

Dropping a DE course...

Every effort should be made to stay in the Dual Enrollment course(s) you are scheduled for!

- A grade of a 59 will be placed on the student's transcript.
- If a student withdraws from a college course, we will make our best attempt to place that student in a corresponding high school course to meet course completion and/or graduation requirements.
- If no corresponding course or credit recovery is possible, the high school counselor updates transcript history with a failing grade for the course which will be entered on the high school permanent record/transcript.

AP vs. Dual Enrollment

AP Course

- AP test determines credit given at college
- Coursework is consistent across the nation
- Cost associated with AP exams
- Higher level institutions prefer that students max out AP courses before taking dual enrollment

Dual Enrollment

- Grade in course determines credit given (Instant; most will transfer)
- Coursework varies by institution & teacher
- Tuition is free
- Dual enrollment courses will remain on college transcript (start your college GPA)

2021 Test Score Guidance

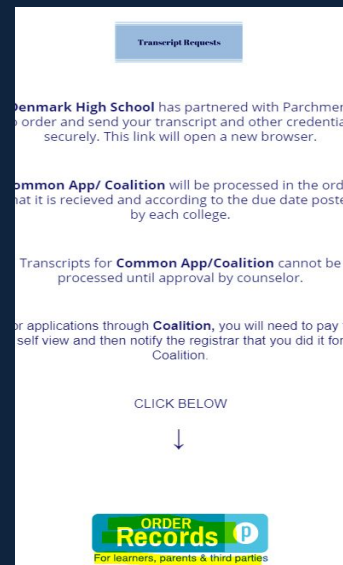
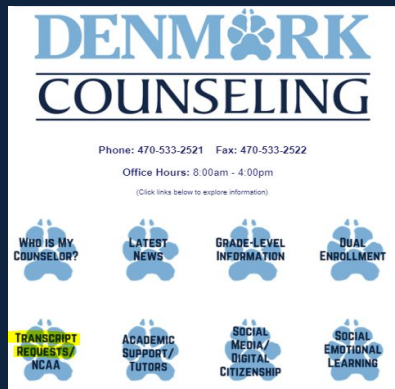
- Please determine if the institution you are applying to has any special directions regarding SAT or ACT in place for Dual Enrollment 2021 applications.
- If you are submitting your SAT score, you'll need to request from College Board through the account you used to register for the exam.
- If you are submitting your ACT score, you submit using the account registered for on ACT.org.

How to send transcripts...

First, go to DHS Counseling:



Second, click on the "Transcript Requests" paw:



Third, click on "order records". This will take you to the Denmark Parchment page. You will need to create a Learner account to request your transcript be sent.

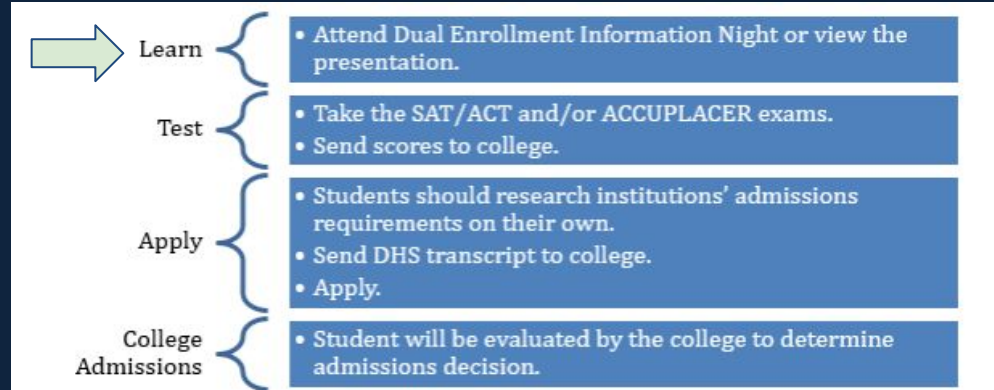
*Students must have applied and informed their school counselor by this deadline. Complete application and tell your counselor BEFORE Spring Break!

FAQs


- **Does DHS add any rigor points to courses that I take at a college?**
 - Students will receive 1.0 Quality Point to their GPA when taking any Dual Enrollment course.
- **Can I still participate in school activities if I attend college full time?**
 - Yes, you can still participate in all school activities. If you are an athlete, you must take a minimum of 5 college classes (2.5 credits per semester) to remain eligible to play.
- **Will Dual Enrollment classes count against my HOPE hours?**
 - Courses do not count against any maximum hourly caps for the HOPE scholarships or grants.
- **Will my student be responsible for the End of Course (EOC) Exam?**
 - GADOE updated EOC guidelines again Fall 2020. The latest:
 - American Literature EOC IS required for DE students
 - US History EOC IS NOT required for DE students
- **Can I participate in Dual Enrollment over the summer?**
 - Yes, if a student enrolls in Dual Enrollment courses during the summer session, the course, grade, and credit will be posted on the high school transcript. There is no option to deny credit.

Next steps



- If you have taken ACT/SAT, decide whether or not you will submit based on college guidelines given
- Send your transcripts
- Complete your college DE application
- Notify your counselor when you are admitted!
