

# *Dual Enrollment*

**Begin college as a high school junior or senior and finish your degree sooner!**



Georgia's Dual Enrollment program provides students with awards for tuition, fees, and books for college courses taken prior to high school graduation. Use this as your admissions guide to becoming a Dual Enrolled *UNG Nighthawk!*

# UNG Requirements

- You must be entering your 11th or 12th grade year in high school.
- Students interested in our cadet program must be at least 17 years of age at the time of enrollment.
- You must present a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 or better in your Required High School Curriculum (RHSC) coursework [usg.edu/assets/student\\_affairs/documents/Staying\\_on\\_Course.pdf](https://ung.edu/assets/student_affairs/documents/Staying_on_Course.pdf).
- You must meet minimum test score requirements on the SAT or ACT.

On the new, redesigned SAT, you must score at least a 26 on the reading section and a 480 on the math section. These scores will be converted to the old SAT equivalents to determine the required combined 970 Critical Reading + Math score. View what your converted SAT scores will be by using SAT's Concordance Tables. On the ACT you must score a composite of 20 with minimum scores of 20 English and 18 math.

Students in unaccredited home school programs must also meet bachelor's degree minimum test score home school requirements [ung.edu/undergraduate-admissions/unaccredited](https://ung.edu/undergraduate-admissions/unaccredited).
- Speak with your high school counselor about the courses you can take at UNG that will count toward high school graduation. Courses must come from the approved UNG Dual Enrollment list, [apps.gsfc.org/SecureNextGen/dsp\\_accel\\_course\\_listings.cfm](https://apps.gsfc.org/SecureNextGen/dsp_accel_course_listings.cfm).
- You must enroll in a bachelor's degree program at UNG.
- Once accepted and enrolled, to continue in the program you must maintain a 2.5 GPA and complete 67% of all attempted classes. All Dual Enrollment students who fall below a 2.0 overall GPA will be dismissed from the program. Students who earn a 2.0 to 2.49 overall GPA will have one semester to raise their overall GPA to a 2.5. Failure to earn an overall GPA of 2.5 will result in dismissal from the program.

## Deadlines

It is very likely we will meet capacity before the deadline and will immediately stop accepting students. Completing your application earlier is better.

Spring (Classes begin in January): **October 1**

Summer (Classes begin in May or June): **March 15**

Fall (Classes begin in August): **March 15**
