World Language Community Service Project Documentation

In addition, worthwhile community service projects require an ongoing commitment on your part.

You should think about the following questions before selecting a community service project:

- *f* What need or problem exists in the community that you are interested in related to the world language subject area?
- *f* What project can be developed to work on this need or problem?
- *f* Will your project provide an important service related to the world language subject area?
- *f* Does the project match your interests, talents, and abilities in relation to the world language subject area?
- *f* Are there any special qualifications you need to work on the project?
- *f* Will you be able to spend the necessary time on the project?
- *f* What planning steps are needed before beginning the project?
- *f* Who needs to be contacted before the project begins?
