McKinney-Vento Purpose

- Identify homeless children and youth
- Facilitate their enrollment, attendance, and academic success in Forsyth County Schools



McKinney-Vento: Federal Definition of Educational Homelessness:



- Children living in a shelter
- 2. Doubled-Up
- 3. Unsheltered (Campground, Car, Workplace, etc...)
- 4. Hotel/Motel

The McKinney-Vento Act is the Federal law that governs educational rights of homeless children and youth.

MV (McKinney Vento) Program Supports:

- 1. Right to immediate enrollment
- 2. Ability to attend their school of origin, even if a student has moved outside attendance lines if it is in the best interest of the child or youth.
- 3. Possible special transportation to school of origin if living outside attendance area.
- 4. Access to resources and supports like school supplies, book bag, free school breakfast and lunch, clothing resources, and referrals to community resources
- 5. One-on-one tutoring in content areas to address academic gaps of Homeless Children and youth (not available in Title 1 Schools)
- 6. Right of parent/guardian to appeal school placement or file other grievances
- 7. Assistance accessing post-secondary options
- 8. And more...
