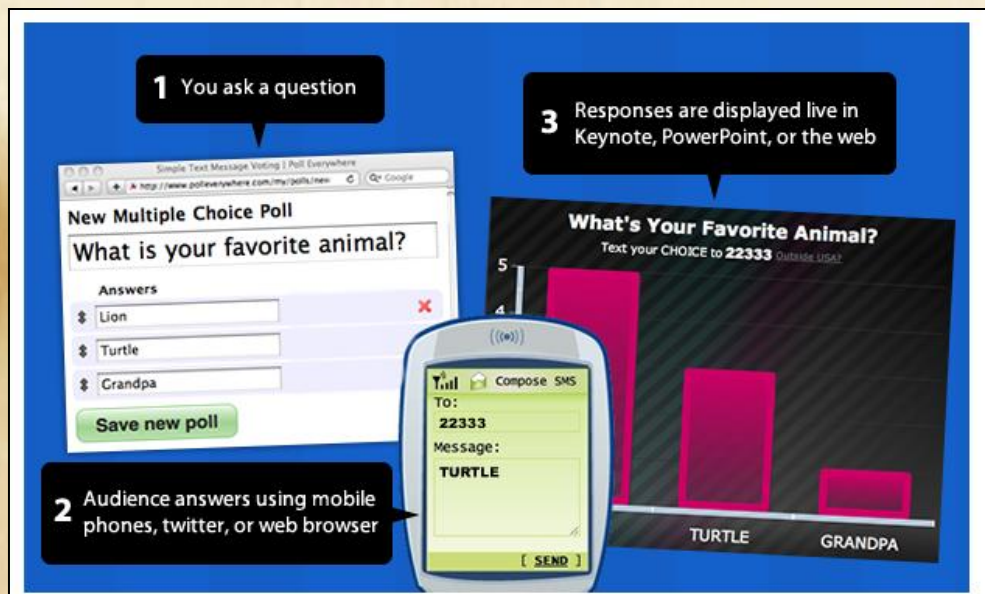



**Poll Everywhere** is an affordable audience response system.

**Poll Everywhere** is free for classes with up to 32 students per section.

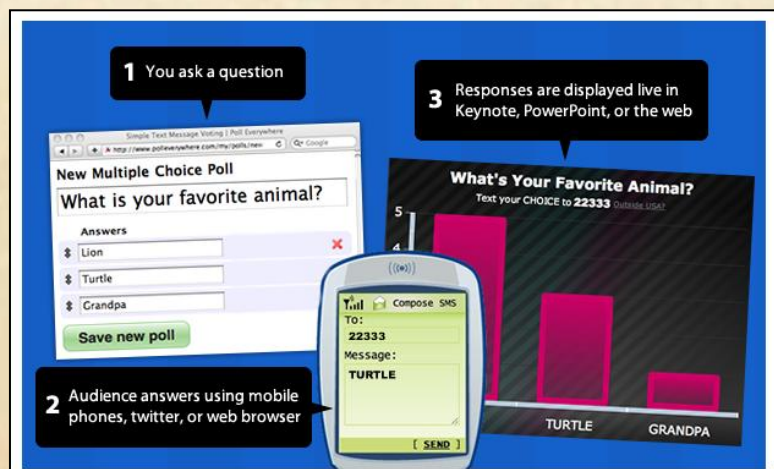
Teachers can use it to:

There are several price points available with special options for educators, including a free plan.



# Creating an Account


This is your last stop before you're creating polls.

# Setting Up a Poll

Your first decision will be what kind of poll to setup.

Choose the poll that fits your needs best.

The first example is the “Multiple choice poll”.

### Create New Poll

<b>Multiple choice poll</b> "Choose your favorite color"	<b>Free text poll</b> "What is your name?"	<b>Goal poll</b> "Set goals or raise money"
		
<b>What is it?</b> With multiple choice polls, you define a list of possible answers. Graphs will display the results in real-time.	<b>What is it?</b> Your audience can text in anything. Gather feedback or identifying information, like names or ID numbers.	<b>What is it?</b> People text in numbers and a thermometer climbs towards a goal. Use this to track pledges, donations, or sales goals.



# Multiple Choice Poll

Enter a question that fits your lesson for the day.

Enter a few choices for the students to select. Use the same selection process you would when building a quiz or test item.

### New Multiple Choice Poll

Ask your audience a short question and provide a few answers to choose from.

**Question**  
Ask "What is your favorite color" with answers "Red", "Blue", & "Green"

# Multiple Choice Poll

You also have options to adjust the poll. Select the options that meet your needs best; the question you ask may require specific options.

**▼ Responses**

These are options for students to use other than the SMS feature of their ubiquitous cell phones.

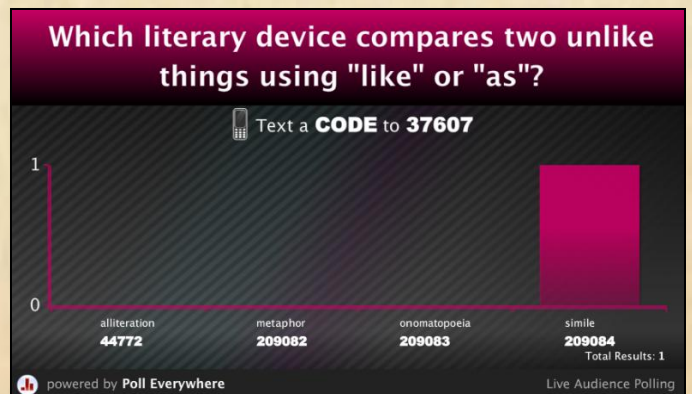
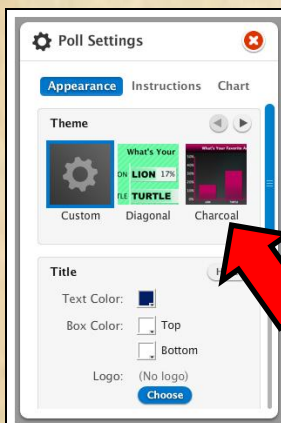
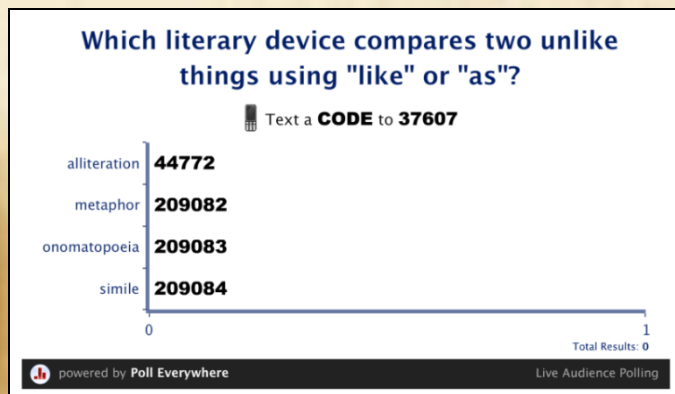
# Multiple Choice Poll

Next you will see your poll in the default settings.

Hovering over the right side of your poll offers choices for settings and appearance.

There is also an option to make the poll full screen.

This feature could be used as a warm-up activity.



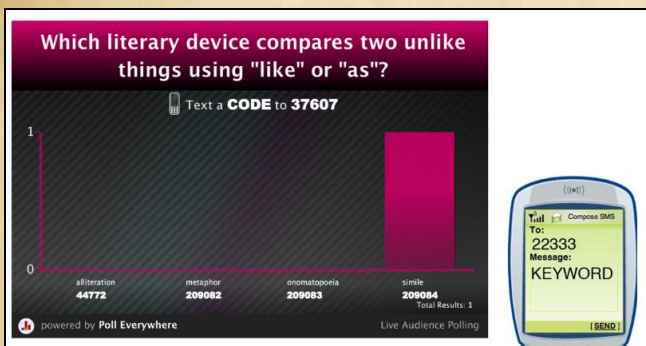
# Multiple Choice Poll

Along the right side of the window are poll management tools.

From this tool bar, you can edit your poll or change how your poll is displayed.

Perhaps one of the most impressive features is the PowerPoint Slide Download.

Using this feature you can embed your poll(s) into a PowerPoint presentation. These polls can then be displayed in real-time in class as students reply.

# Free Text Polls

Other poll formats allow students the freedom to enter whatever text they like.

This could include questions for the teacher. Using this feature allows some less reluctant students to voice their concerns and allow them to take appropriate risks in class.

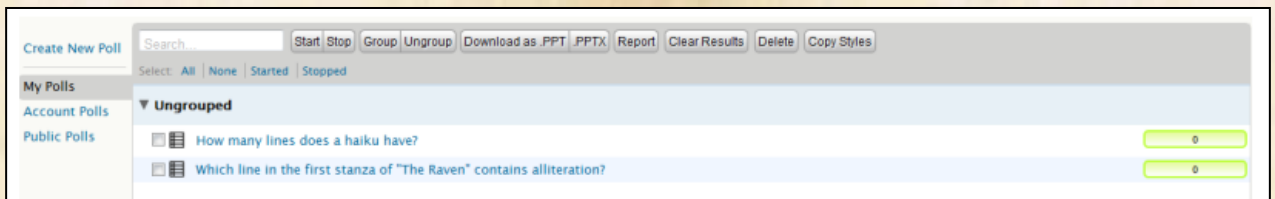

Use this feature with caution, as the free version does not allow moderation or filtering of responses; certain students may like to exploit this situation.
